Potential Need for Green Card

No deal Brexit and using your vehicle abroad

Update 11th April 2019:

Following the decision taken on 10th April 2019 to extend Brexit talks until 31 Oct 2019, further advice on Green Cards will be available nearer that time. Presently Green Cards are not required.

In light of the United Kingdom withdrawing from the European Union and if there should be a no-deal scenario, if you wish to drive your vehicle outside of the UK it will be compulsory to travel with a Green Card document.

A Green Card gives you the minimum required level of insurance in the country you are travelling in, usually equivalent to Third Party Only. It does not give you Fully Comprehensive insurance for the insured vehicle. It does not cover your vehicle Fully Comprehensive whilst abroad.

Additional cover to allow Foreign Use of your vehicle on a Fully Comprehensive basis can be purchased via your broker.

Your travel dates and countries that you will be visiting should be discussed with your Broker and if you meet our criteria your Green Card document will then be issued by them. Whilst it is difficult at this stage to determine what exactly will happen in the event of no-deal, we are keen to alert our customers to the possibility of requiring a Green Card.
